

IN HOME THERAPIST:

The In-Home Clinical Therapist will report to the clinical supervisor and/or program director. The therapist is responsible for counseling, reporting, administering and delivering therapeutic services to individuals and families referred to Franklin-Wright Settlements. The therapist will function as an independent contractor providing weekly home-based and office-based services to referred clients. Monthly consults with DHS referring workers and the clinical supervisor is required to determine their needs and develop treatment plans/court reports for clients, in response to those needs. Providing therapy sessions, maintain paper and electronic client files, functioning as an organization liaison with DHS and offering support/resources to referred persons are the primary job requirements for the In-Home Clinical Therapist.

Applicant Must Possess a State of Michigan Profession License (i.e. LLMSW, LLPC, TTLP, CAADC, CADC). Applicants MUST have at least 3 years of experience in Child Welfare services; recent DHS Central Registry Clearance, Resume, and three references (two professional; one personal). The position is contractual and the caseload expectation is 5-10 cases.

- Typically, clinicians must possess a master degree from an accredited program in one of the following related fields of study:
 - o Social Work; counseling and guidance; rehabilitation counseling, vocational counseling, psychology, pastoral counseling with approved counseling curriculum documented on transcript; family therapy, or any other related field.
- Working knowledge of growth and development of children, adolescents and adults must be documented via course work on the transcript, certificates or resume.
